Carpet Cleaning Guide: Hot Water Extraction Method

Hot water extraction carpet cleaning is a relatively long task and it is recommended that is done only when needed rather than on a regular basis.

Preparation of the area

- Assemble all equipment and ensure it is in good working order, make sure the carpet is clear and place out any necessary caution signs.
- Pick up any large items of rubbish and vacuum carpet.
- Pre-treat any spots or stains in the area to be cleaned, Always ensure that you test a small inconspicuous area before use to check for colour fastness.
- Ensure that windows are open or that a Dehumidifier /air blower are available.

Hot water Extraction Cleaning Advice

- Prepare carpet extraction cleaner ensuring the correct dilution rate and pour into solution tank, Take care to check solution on an inconspicuous area beforehand as a precaution against carpet damage.
- Ensure that the machine is operating correctly and that both the spray nozzles and suction are working.
- Ensure that only a trained operative uses a carpet extraction machine.
- Always start furthest away from the door and then plan the route, to ensure that
 you do not need to step on any areas already cleaned.
- Use the equipment as per the training.
- Leave the carpet to dry.
- Vacuum the area.
