

Carpet Cleaning Guide Spot and Stain Removal





Carpet Cleaning Guide: Spot and Stain Removal

Spot and stain removal are core disciplines in carpet maintenance. Spots can be defined as recent spillage on the carpet, a stain is characteristically an un-removed spot and difficult to remove.

Preparation of the Area

- It is important to identify the type of stain, some stains such as ink and paint require specialist stain removal products
- Assemble all equipment and ensure it is in good working order, make sure the carpet is clear and place out any necessary caution signs.
- Some floor cleaning products may release fumes, so if possible make sure the cleaning area is well ventilated, opening windows and doors whenever possible.

Spot and Stain Removal Advice

- Remove the majority of the stain by blotting or scraping, taking care not to damage to carpet.
- Test the stain remover by testing on a unobtrusive area, if the carpet dye bleeds, stop immediately
- If not, spray other spots, agitate with a pad/ brush then blot the stain with a white paper.
- Vacuum the area when stain removal agent is dry.
- Clean equipment and return it to store room.
